## **From the Headmaster**

Pupils who are reading this will have no idea how to complete the blanks in the following slogan, but all the parents will. That is to say, all of us who were living in Great Britain at any time from the 1950s to the 1990s. Here goes: "A Mars a day helps you \_\_\_\_\_, and ."

It has been twenty years since Mars last advertised its chocolate bars using the words 'work', 'rest' and 'play'. Has enough time elapsed for Francis Holland School, Regent's Park to repurpose them? I will let you be the judge of that, because it gives me great pleasure to announce that Miss Mahieu, the Pastoral Deputy Head, is launching 'Work, Rest and Play Fortnight' this November (6th – 17th).

What is more, Miss Mahieu has booked Anna Kessel, the author of *Eat Sweat Play* and sports journalist for *the Guardian* and *Observer* to deliver the final 'Work, Rest and Play' assembly to the whole school. Finally, our Head of Careers, Mr Bossé, has arranged for a symposium to take place after school on Thursday 16th November. In front of an audience, a panel of experts will debate and discuss 'The Workplace of the Future' with reference to a changing jobs market and the impact of technology. I warmly encourage parents to attend this event with your daughter – tickets will be available online later in the term.

So, in conclusion, may I commend 'Work, Rest and Play Fortnight' to you. It takes place during the second and third weeks after half-term. No Mars Bars!




## **RGS Young Geographer of the Year**
