### Dedicated teachers inspire pupils



During the first three years, pupils follow a broad academic curriculum, which includes all three sciences, Latin and two foreign languages chosen from French, German, Spanish and Italian. IT is taught as an integral part of the curriculum. Support is available for girls who need help with learning strategies.

At GCSE, all students follow a core curriculum in addition to a wide range of optional subjects such as Classical Greek. Girls have a choice of more than twenty subjects at A level, including History of Art, Government and Politics, Drama and Theatre, Psychology and Religious Studies.




#### Art is popular

Art is studied by all girls in their first three years and by many pupils at GCSE and A level.

Participation is actively encouraged at every stage of a production and in addition to the school plays, there is an annual inter-house drama competition and pupils also write, direct and perform plays of their own.









## Encouraging team spirit

through participation in sport is central to life at Francis Holland and Physical Education remains at the heart of the curriculum. As well as having Central London's largest outdoor sports facility in Regent's Park on our doorstep, we have our own indoor swimming pool and gymnasium. We offer an enormous range of activities such as netball, hockey, tennis, rounders, water-polo, swimming, gymnastics, volleyball and yoga.

Regular sporting tours are undertaken with our netball and hockey teams having recently enjoyed successful tours to South Africa and Malaysia and our swimming teams have competed in Malta, Cyprus and Mallorca.

In addition, senior girls have the opportunity to choose activities as diverse as canoeing, golf, scuba-diving, fencing and modern dance.





### The Sixth Form is an exciting time

when students make decisions about university and their future lives. Sixth Formers have use of their own dedicated Sixth Form Centre, Linhope House, which features a large Common Room, a state-of-the-art Think Lab, and modern classrooms with integrated technology. An extensive range of academic subjects is available at A level and the School prides itself on its ability to offer a wide choice of subject combinations. All Sixth Form students follow a general curriculum which includes Current Affairs and Physical Education.

Beyond the curriculum, an array of academic enrichment opportunities are available designed to develop leadership skills, such as participating in voluntary work, attending or indeed founding co-curricular clubs, and there is also a weekly lecture programme given by a distinguished list of invited guest speakers.
