

'Leading the Way at Linhope House'

The Francis Holland, Regent's Park Sixth Form is based in our state-of-the-art Sixth Form Centre, Linhope House. Only a two-minute walk from our main school building at Ivor Place, Linhope features superb study and leisure spaces, such as soundproofed study booths, a Think Lab, a breakfast bar and a spacious Common Room. Sixth formers are connected to the rest of the school as they travel between buildings for their lessons, offering a 'college' feel and a perfect transition between school life and higher education. We offer an outstanding academic provision and aim to foster independence and leadership skills in our students.

Our Sixth Form vision is guided by our four core pillars of knowledge, compassion, perseverance and spirit. We aim to inspire students to pursue their academic and co-curricular passions, and to leave us as young adults equipped with resilience, courage and empathy. Our curriculum offers academic rigour, as well as choice and flexibility, with 81.5% of A level students achieving A*-B grades in 2023.

In addition to excellent teaching, students benefit from an array of academic enrichment opportunities including a weekly lecture programme. We have welcomed a diverse range of speakers this year, from Ben Scher on homelessness, to Jenny Halpern Prince on digital media entrepreneurship, to slam poet, Harry Baker. Weekly Life Skills lessons take place, featuring sessions on life at university, AI, law in practice and public

speaking. We also have an elective programme to provide additional breadth and foster intellectual curiosity. Our Hale Lecture Series continues to go from strength to strength; this is a student-led interactive interview series. Sixth Formers orchestrate these visits from start to finish, developing their confidence and soft skills such as research, public speaking, and making informed and sensitive conversation.

Encouraged to take on various leadership responsibilities, our students can help to run clubs and societies, become House Captains or Prefects, take up volunteering opportunities, or broaden their horizons through some of the many enriching co-curricular opportunities on offer. Throughout the two years of Sixth Form, our students gain interpersonal skills and adaptability.

All students can apply to be on the Head Girl's Team, with positions including the Deputy Head Girl, the Senior Prefect, a President of the Help Fund, the Sixth Form Delegate, the Equality, Diversity,

Inclusion & Belonging Ambassador and the Environmental Captain. The team meets weekly with both the Head of Sixth Form and the Head, and liaises regularly with younger students, acting as role models. We value student voice; at the regular year group forum, suggestions for improvement are heard and often acted upon.
