The English and maths courses can also be beneficial if you wish to study other courses at WAES such as childcare, health and

social care, computing, business, accounting, art, ceramics, floristry, fashion, hairdressing and make-up.

If you wish to enrol on one of the functional skills English or maths courses you will need to complete an initial assessment.
