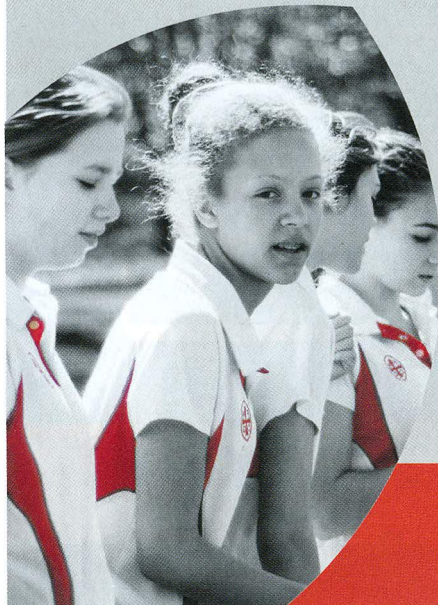

## New swimming pool at Francis Holland to celebrate 100 years on Regent's Park site

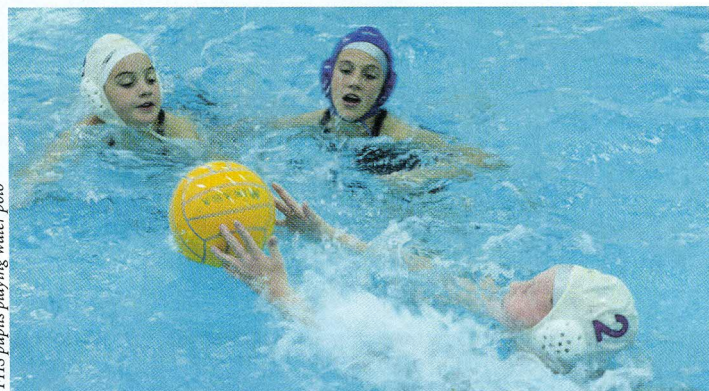
To celebrate one hundred years on its current site, Francis Holland School, Regent's Park has launched an exciting new building project. The existing swimming pool along with the changing room facilities and showers are undergoing a complete renovation. The new ultra-modern swimming facility will be a tremendous asset to the 470 girls aged 11 to 18.

A key feature of the new FHS swimming pool will be an adjustable floor, which can be raised fully. This will enable the pool to be deep enough for sports such as diving and water polo, as well as being shallow enough for the swimming squads to train. Another benefit is the new cooling system which

will allow the pool space to return to an ambient temperature in just 20 minutes so that the cover on the pool will transform into a floor providing space for other extra-curricular activities. Over 70 clubs covering sport, drama, music and art contribute to the school's lively extra-curricular schedule.

Work to refurbish and rebuild the swimming amenities began in December 2014 and is scheduled to be completed in Autumn 2015, when there will be further celebrations to mark the school's relocation from Baker Street to Ivor Place in 1915 including publication of a book charting the school's 137 year history.
