Music is at the heart of Francis Holland. We have opportunities for all girls to explore their musical pursuits, including a variety of orchestras, choirs and ensembles. Singing is very strong in the school.

It is an exciting time to be a music scholar at Francis Holland. We develop our advanced musicians and music scholars through workshops and masterclass opportunities. Chamber Music is flourishing with girls taking part in a variety of ensembles. We offer opportunities to contribute to musical events inside and outside of school

### **Co-curricular Commitment**

We expect a full commitment to the musical life of the school from scholars and exhibitioners. Girls take part in a number of activities including the orchestra and choir. We encourage leadership roles for scholars so they set an example to others.

#### Performance

Music scholars are expected to play at Open Days and other events as required. They play during Monday, Wednesday and Friday morning whole-school assemblies and at other performances, when required.

## **GCSE/A level Music**

We hope scholars consider taking GCSE/A level Music. Public exams present the opportunity for girls to develop musicianship, engage with peers, explore music history, and develop compositional skills.

## What Scholars can expect from Francis Holland Regent's Park

Scholars can expect commitment from the Music department to further their musical development by having engaging opportunities to develop in a way that balances academic and musical life. We want our scholars to feel that they are a vital part of the school and Scholars are reviewed annually to assess their progress and reward commitment.
